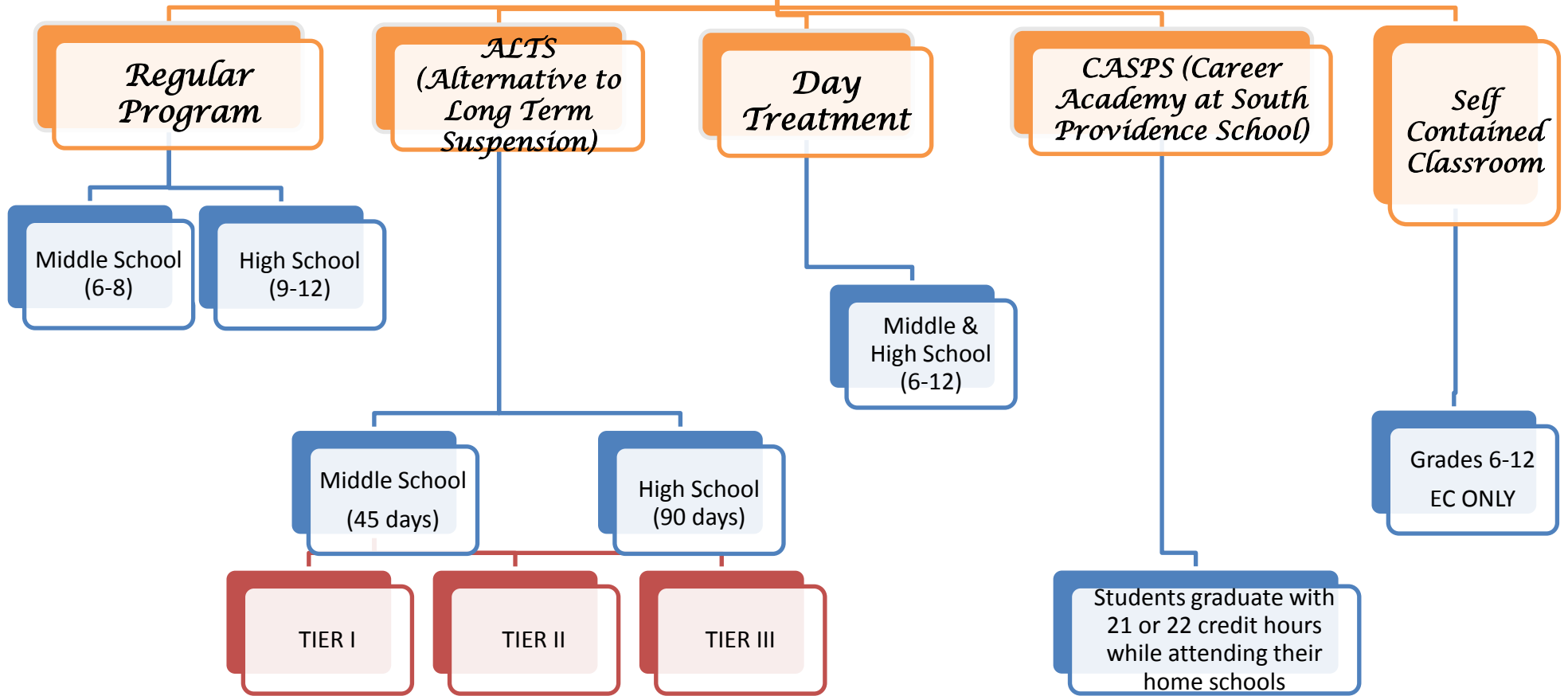


South Providence School



South Providence School

Regular Program

- Middle School (6-8) & High School (9-12)
- Students are referred/accepted/placed through the Screening Committee
- Students must successfully progress through a Level System (1-4), demonstrating appropriate behavior expectations
- Eligible to return to their home school upon successful completion of Levels 1-4

ALTS

- Alternative to Long-Term Suspension
- Middle School (6-8); 45 days
- High School (9-12); 90 days/1 semester
- Attending ALTS is optional
- Tier I, Tier II (not for middle school), Tier III
- Classes are delivered through distance learning (Odysseyware, NCVPS)
- Tier I high school students will have access to South Providence electives (H/PE, Art, CTE courses, Spanish)

Self-Contained Classroom

- Middle and High school students
- EC students ONLY
- EC placement NOT South Providence placement
- Instruction delivered in a blended environment (on-line and direct instruction)

CASPS

- Students graduate with 21 or 22 (for students entering 9th grade in 2012-2013) credit hours while attending their home schools
- Students can participate in graduation ceremonies at the home schools
- CASPS students receive a Career Academy at South Providence School diploma
- An application process is required (See School Counselor at home schools)
- Designed to assist students who have been in high school at least 3 semesters w/minimal amount of credits earned

Day Treatment

- Serves middle school students (6-12)
- EC classification; Medicaid or NC Health Choice
- Instruction delivered in a blended environment (on-line and direct instruction)
- Must have had mental health services that have been unsuccessful or as a step-down
- Parent support is required
- IQ minimum of 70 - has to be able to process and benefit from therapy
- Student has to have some motivation to change
- Discharge depends on a variety of issues - they could "reach maximum benefit" from the program (PBH or Value Options no longer authorizes treatment) they may have not met their goals
- There are some other criteria (don't treat only substance abuse, etc.)
